OU READING FOR PLEASURE

The OU Reading for Pleasure website is designed to help teachers establish a culture of RfP in their schools. It provides access to the key findings of recent research, examples of practice from classrooms across the country and other useful resources. The Why, the What, and the How of RfP all on one website.

BOOKS FOR KEEPS

Books for Keeps is an online magazine that carries reviews of children's books as well as articles addressing wider issues in the children's book world. The magazine comes out every two months and is a great way to become well-informed about the children's book world. An invaluable resource.



BOOKS FOR TOPICS

Created by a former primary school teacher, Books for Topics provides book lists and book recommendations to support all areas of the primary curriculum. The books are chosen by a panel of educators making this a great place to start your search for engaging books for the primary classroom.

YOUNG WRITERS

Young Writers run poetry and creative writing competitions for primary and secondary schools throughout the academic year. Competitions are supported by free teaching resources and, if selected, pupils will get the chance to see their work published in regional anthologies.
